Mae Iechyd Cyhoeddus Cymru wedi gweld cynnydd yn nifer yr achosion sydd wedi'u cadarnhau o glefydau heintus sy'n gysylltiedig ag ymweliadau â ffermydd, atyniadau anifeiliaid ar gyfer ymwelwyr, a chysylltiad ag anifeiliaid mewn ysgolion a lleoliadau gofal plant. Mae'r rhain yn cynnwys brigiadau o achosion ac achosion unigol o salwch yn y stumog. Mae llawer o'r afiechydon hyn yn gysylltiedig â chyswllt agos a hirfaith ag anifeiliaid, baw anifeiliaid, a deunydd gorwedd halogedig. Re: Farm visits and Animal contacts

Public Health Wales has seen an increase in confirmed cases of infectious diseases linked to visits to farms, animal visitor attractions, and contact with animals within schools and childcare settings. These include both outbreaks and individual cases of stomach illness. Many of these illnesses are linked to close and prolonged contact with animals, animal faeces, and contaminated bedding. Some cases have occurred after cuddling newborn animals inside pens, touching animals that are visibly dirty, eating food in a close proximity to animals and where there is poor access to proper hand-washing facilities.

Several harmful germs can be passed from animals to people in these settings. These include E. coli, Cryptosporidium, Salmonella, and Campylobacter. Some of these infections can cause serious illness and, in rare cases, can be fatal. Young children, older people, and those with weaker immune systems are at higher risk. Only a small number of these germs are needed to cause infection.

To help reduce the risk of infection, Public Health Wales recommends following the guidance document **"Health protection in Children and Young People settings (including Education)"**, available at:
