

THE NEW PERSONAL STATEMENT

We're excited to announce a significant update for 2026 entry. The new personal statement will have three sections, each carefully scaffolded with specific, mandatory questions to improve the application experience for all. These three questions will give higher education providers the information they tell us is the most use to them.

The structured format will provide students from all backgrounds with clear guidance through the writing process to ensure consistency. It will help them to articulate their thoughts and include key information for their university application.

1. Why do you want to study this course or subject?

This is your opportunity to showcase your passion and knowledge of your chosen subject area and to demonstrate to universities and colleges why they are a good fit for you and your future ambitions.

2. How have your qualifications and studies helped you to prepare for this course or subject?

This is your chance to shout about relevant or transferable skills you've gained from your education and highlight your understanding of how they will help you succeed in this subject area.

3. What else have you done to prepare outside of education, and why are these experiences useful?

This is your chance to reflect on any other activities you have undertaken outside of your education or personal experiences which further demonstrate your suitability for the course. This section is likely to be deeply personal to you, so anything you include should be meaningful and relevant to you.

NO APPLICATION FEE FOR STUDENTS WHO RECEIVED FREE SCHOOL MEALS

As a charity focused on fair access to higher education, we're committed to removing obstacles for students, especially those experiencing hardship. With living costs rising, we're opening opportunities and getting rid of the application fee for students who have been in receipt of free school meals.

HOW WILL IT WORK?

We need your support to launch this new initiative for 2025. Please complete the necessary steps in the Adviser Portal and encourage eligible students to declare their receipt of free school meals.

Eligible students will need to:

- **Declare they are/or have been in receipt of free school meals in the 'More About You' section of the application.**
- **Choose the option 'Pay By Centre' when they review and submit their application from 3 September 2024.**

To support your eligible students to receive the fee waiver you'll need to:

- ✓ Check your application fee payment method in 'Centre Management' is set to a method that enables invoicing. This ensures UCAS can apply the fee waiver to eligible students, and they do not need to pay when they submit their application.
- ✓ Encourage eligible students to make a positive self-declaration in the 'More About You' section that they have been in receipt of free school meals at some point in the last six years.
- ✓ Provide agreement in the Adviser Portal that there is evidence that the student qualifies for the fee waiver.

Centres will not be invoiced for eligible students confirmed in the Adviser Portal.

Please share this guidance with your colleagues so that all eligible applicants can benefit from the fee waiver.



NEW HISTORICAL ENTRY GRADES TOOL

University can sometimes seem out of reach. Especially for students from disadvantaged or underrepresented backgrounds who can feel daunted by the entry requirements.

By sharing historical grades data, we give students an indication of the grade profiles previously accepted by universities and colleges, so they can compare them with the current entry requirements.
